It has been quite a year. A couple of years, actually, when you take Covid into consideration. It's been a while since things seemed "normal," but we have always been under God's gracious care. And He has blessed us in ways that we could never even imagine. In the fall of 2020, when Covid-19 shut almost everything down, we had the first virtual benefit. And Mary Jane's and Andris' permanent home in Haiti was finished and furnished through the generous donations of many of you. Some of you even picked out items from the wish list and sent donations so that those items could be purchased in Haiti. In 2021, we started out thinking we would go back to the in-person benefit, but it quickly became apparent that Mary Jane and Andris would not be able to travel. So, we went back to virtual, and we raised funds for the preschool, trade schools, and daily operations. That brings us to 2022, and we are in a different world of upheaval and gang violence that sometimes seems to have no end in sight. It would be easy to focus on the current chaotic situation in Haiti and fall into despair. But God has again provided for the mission through your generosity. Funds have been raised to keep the mission running for now and to complete the wall. We are reminded in 1 Thessalonians 16-18 that we are to:

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

So please keep praying with us and thanking Him for His many blessings.

### **Meet Mark Gunderson**

He is the coordinator for student sponsorships, and he may just hold the record for the most trips to Living Hope Ministries in Haiti! (Besides Mary Jane, of course.)

My name is Mark Gunderson and I'm currently serving as a Living Hope board member and the Student Sponsorship Coordinator. My relationship with Mary Jane and Andris began in 2008 when I became our church's (Zion Lutheran Church, Ann Arbor, MI) advocate for Living Hope and officially joined the Living Hope Board. It's been a very rewarding and spiritually fulfilling experience to serve our Lord and global partners in this capacity. I organized our church's first mission trip to Living Hope in 2009 with no idea what to expect. I was a complete bobble-head planning and leading my first global mission trip. But with Mary Jane's and Andris's steady and calm presence, it worked out just fine as our team spontaneously put together a 3-day teacher training conference. It was an eye-opening experience that began a decade-long ministry partnership with Mary Jane & Andris and their staff. On Zion's return mission trips from 2011-2018 (9 total), it felt like I was visiting family. Mary Jane and Andris became my Christian sister and brother.

Our mission teams, numbering between six and 18, including many friends-of-Zion, participated in a wide variety of projects and activities over the years, including: photographing and measuring all the students for the sponsorship program; painting the inside of the newly completed church; installing a zipline over the soccer field; creating photo necklaces for each student; building a new roof over the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade classroom; visiting the University of Michigan sponsored Nursing school; cleaning and organizing the storage rooms; bringing & teaching ukuleles, trumpets, flutes and drums; painting the pre-school tables; leading a 3-day teacher training seminar; testing the onsite well water; teaching BBQ to the Cooking class; leading Sunday youth group team building activities; singing and playing instruments for church service; playing soccer at recess; teaching dental hygiene; leading MANY craft projects geared to each grade level; helping with MANY home maintenance type projects (replacing toilets, hanging shelves, fixing screen doors, etc.); and playing Farkle in evenings to wind-down. We also had the opportunity to see some of the beautiful Haitian countryside with trips into the mountains, to the beach, and a visit to the resort town, Jacmel. Mary Jane and Andris made all our team members feel like family, and they loved sharing their home and ministry with us.

I am sad I have not been able to return to visit since 2018, due to caring for aging parents, COVID, and now the political unrest. I still long to return to see my sisters and brothers-in-Christ and to see a much-transformed campus. I stay connected with Zoom board meetings, and occasional calls to Mary Jane. The task of taking all the photos and measurements of the students in support of the sponsorship program has now fallen onto Mary Jane. But as with all her other activities, she carries on with a servant's heart. I've witnessed Mary Jane's and Andris's unshakable faithfulness and bottomless energy to carry out their mission and ministry, sometimes in the face of extreme difficulties. It is this reason that I have come to view my visits and support of Living Hope as a way to re-calibrate my own world view on what is really important and to live in the love and trust in our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Student sponsorship is so important because it provides the children with a daily hot and nutritious meal, textbooks, and school supplies. It also provides a substantial part of the teachers' salaries. And you have the added blessing of having the opportunity to build a relationship with your student if you like. The suggested donation to sponsor one child is \$40/month.

## The Haiti Update ... Hi Everyone,

We really appreciate all your thoughts, prayers, and support. We continue to focus on what we can do, not what we can't. God is always faithful. We are still unable to open the schools due to the political climate and the gang activities and threats, so we continue working on projects that have needed to be done, but there was never time. Sunday school, Church, and bi-weekly Bible studies are going well.

We send someone to get us local groceries every 7-10 days. Availability is limited and things are pricey, but we are always thankful for what we do get. Bottled water is rare and prices have tripled. We ran out of diesel in late Oct. as we were dismissing the people from church, and have been unable to get fuel. As of this past Friday, some fuel deliveries to gas stations have resumed, but we have not yet been able to get it in our area safely. The gangs and political forces continue to control the fuel, streets, and activities. We turned off the refrigerator and freezer last week. We finally had 3 hours of city power on one day, the first in a month. Our invertor at the house is acting up so we are having quiet evenings. We still have solar at the school, so we charge our phones and rechargeable light bulbs there during the day and bring them back to the house at night.

We have not had internet since the cables were cut and the electricity went off, so we rely on our phones. Everyone carries 2 phones in case one stops working. Despite days, and even weeks, of the phone services being inconsistent, we have still been blessed to be able to keep in touch.

We have many downed trees from the recent storms. Many of the staff have helped with the tree clean up and are making charcoal with the downed trees. This process has been interesting and productive as we work together to cut and haul the branches and logs to make the charcoal. Those who help get some of the finished product for cooking their meals at home. This has kept the staff busy and given us all something to cook with as well.

We chose not to let the current situation in Haiti dictate our attitudes or thoughts. We continue to look to God in the midst of these difficulties. We know and are assured of His mercy, His grace, His protection, and His provision. We constantly feel the steadfast peace of God and know the Lord will intervene in His perfect timing.

Please continue to pray for the forgiveness of the leaders of Haiti, the gangs, and others involved in the problems of Haiti according to 1 Timothy 2:1-2. Also, for the children, youth, and people of Haiti, as well as the missionaries and foreigners, continue to pray for God's divine peace, protection, and deliverance.


